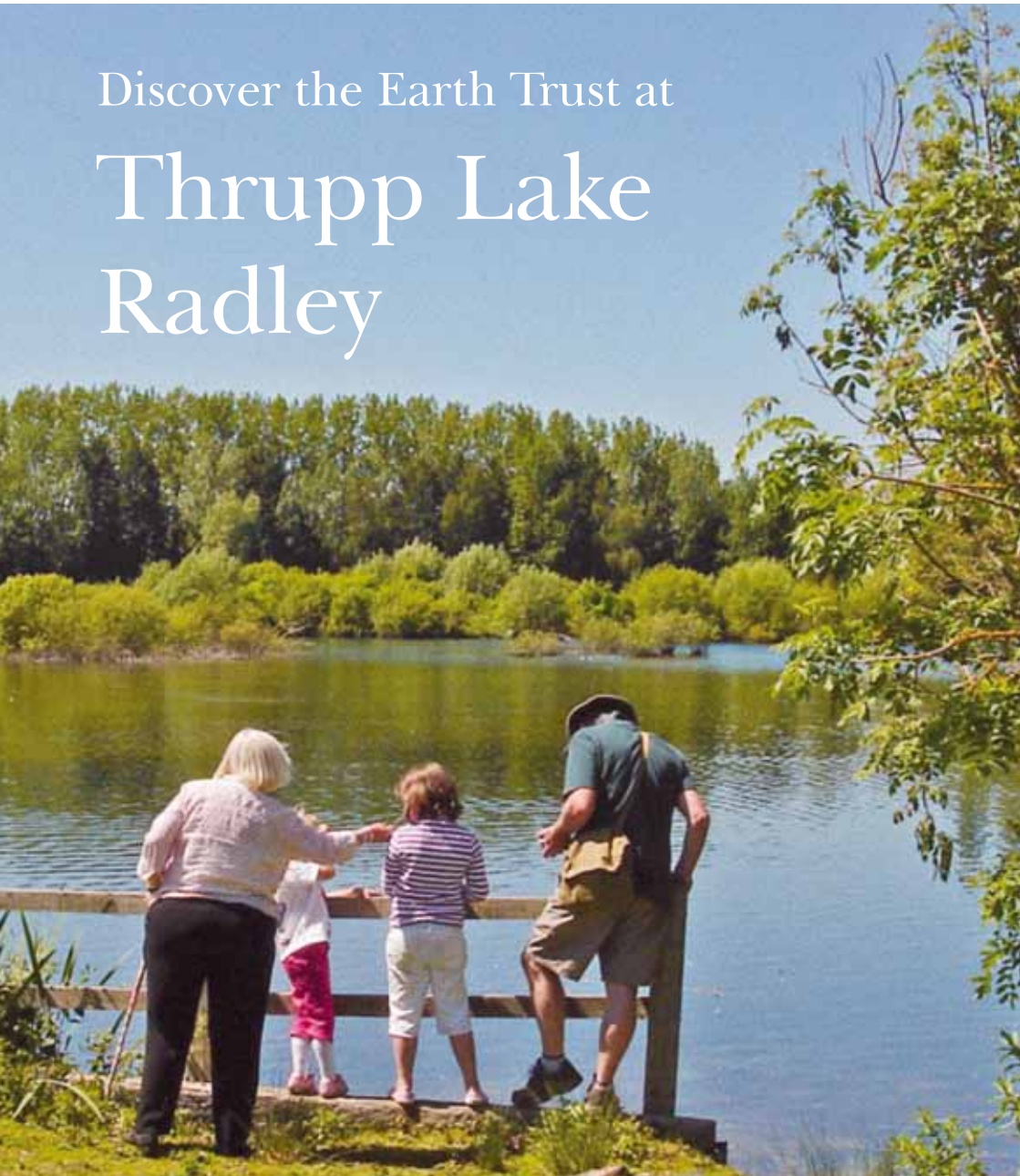




Discover the Earth Trust at

Map Key

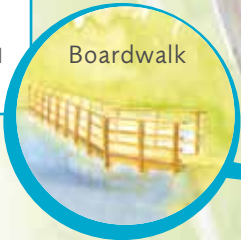

-  View point



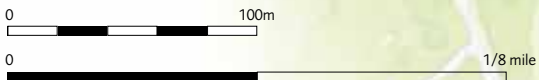
This corner is a great place to see common spotted orchids.



At the boardwalk you can get really close to the water's edge and watch dragonflies darting around the shallows.



From the bird hide you can watch lots of wild birds such as the great crested grebe and kingfisher.

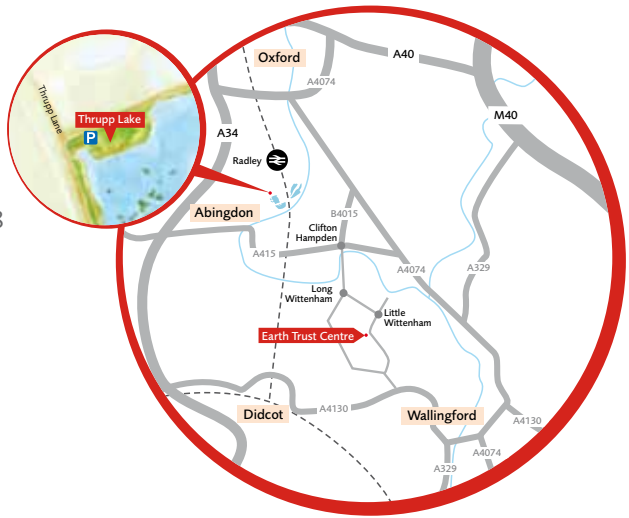
